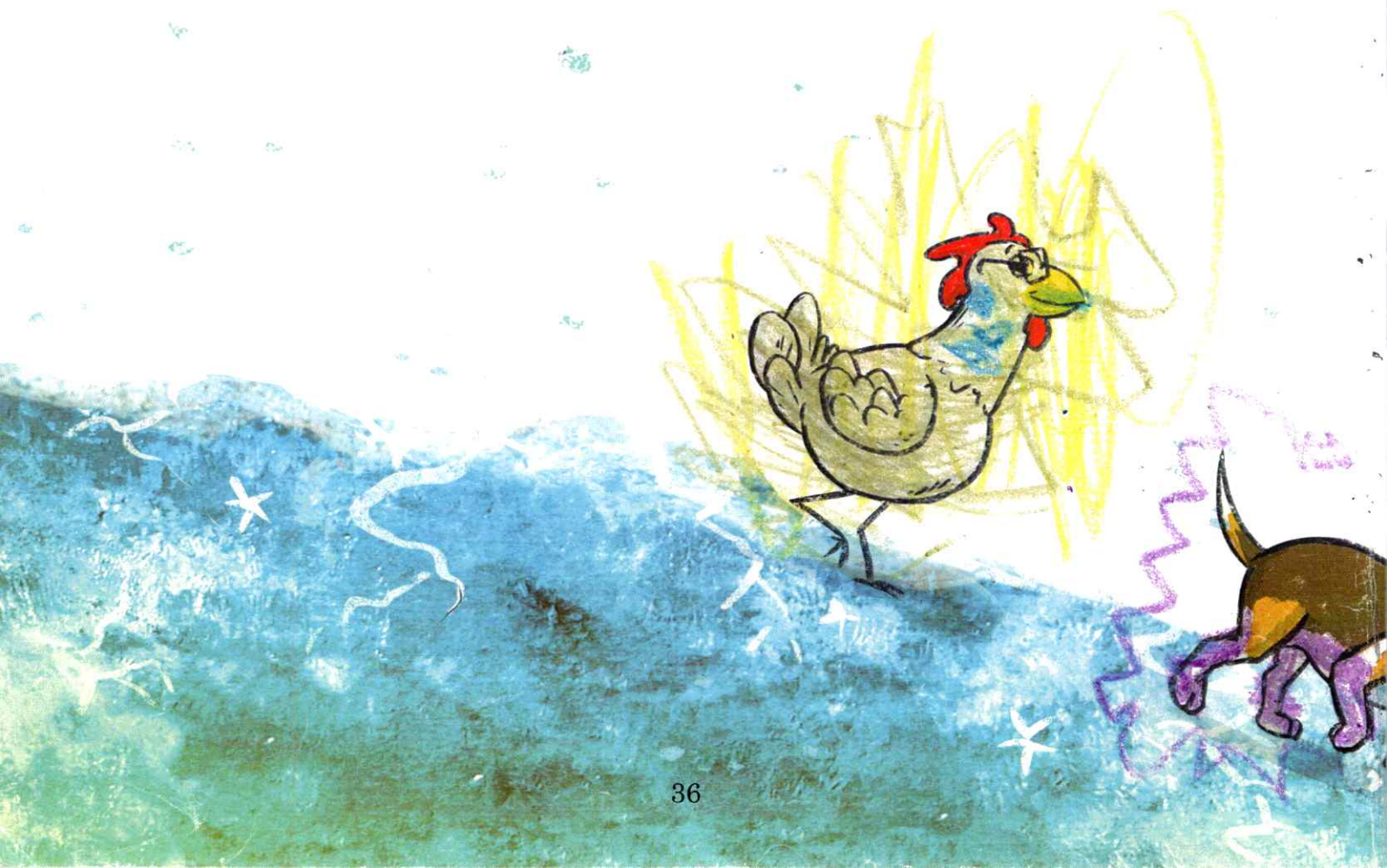




The reader of this page sat up.
