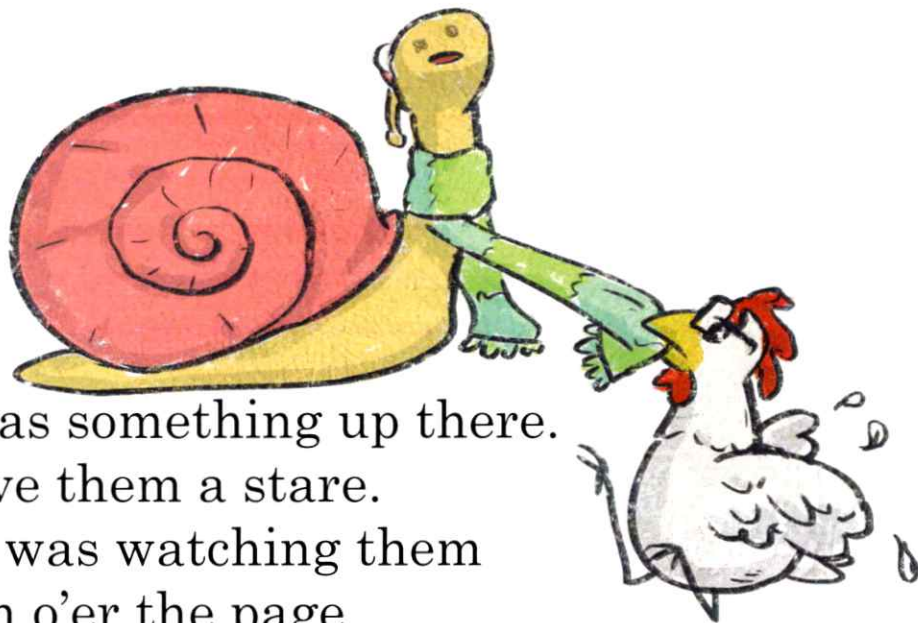




Yes, there was something up there.
