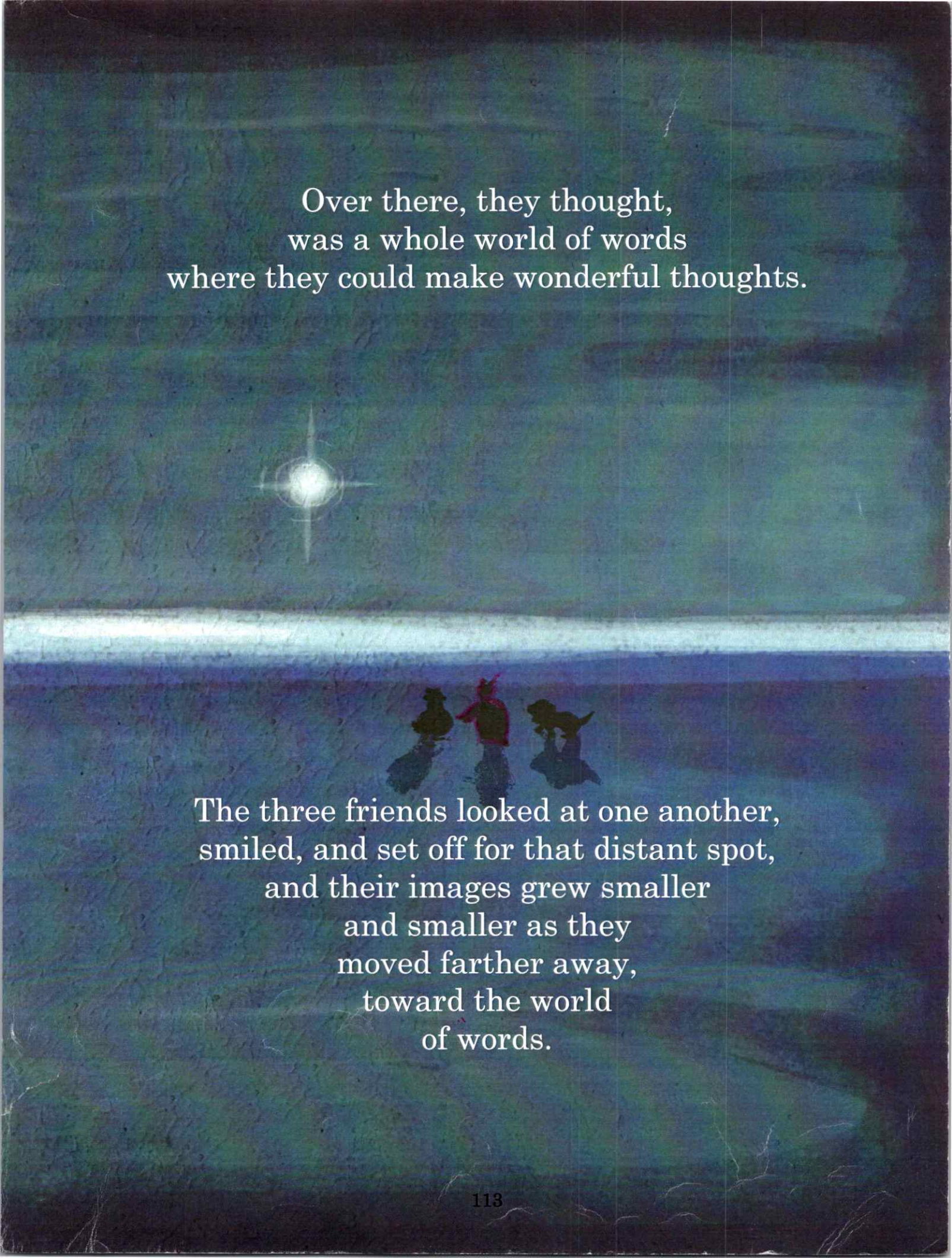




Over there, they thought,
