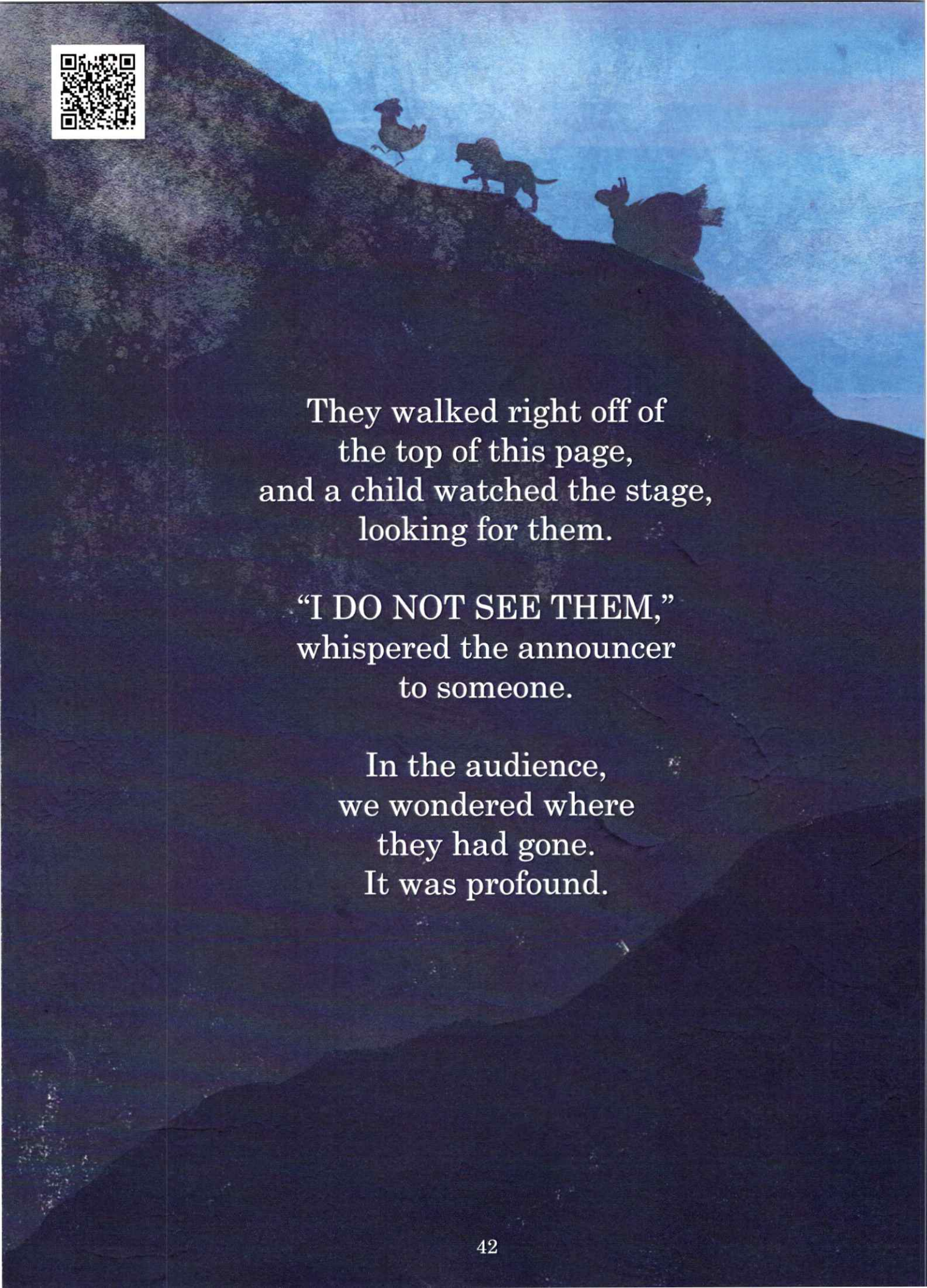

adj. n. v. pron. adj. adj. n.
subj. **AVP**

3. Poodle suddenly **ate** a big apple.
n. adv. v. adj. adj. n.
subj. **AVP**

4. A weary chicken **danced** in the yard.
adj. adj. n. v. prep. adj. n.
subj. **AVP**

5. Sidney **ran** a very fast race.
n. v. adj. adv. adj. n.
subj. **AVP**
