For each sentence, identify the *prepositional phrase*, the *preposition*, and the *object* of the preposition. Then tell whether the relationship is one of space, time, or something else, such as direction, similarity, or possession.

1. The frog awoke before the sunrise.
2. The chicken slept inside the cave.
3. The dog with the spot hid the frog.
4. The dune saw a frog like a log.
5. Poodle saw a frog on the dune.
6. Poodle and What? walked toward him.
7. What? walked around the frog carefully.
8. Polaris quickly faded into the dark sky.
