8. Poodle saw something like a meteor.



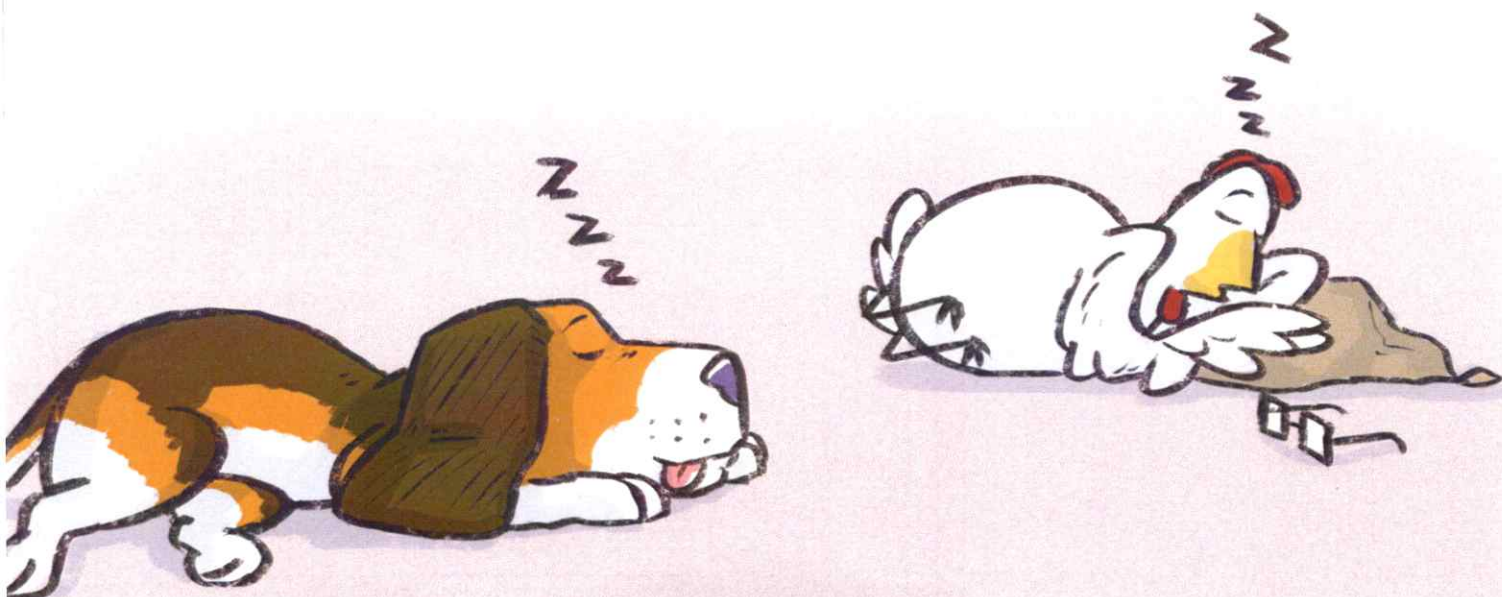
Act Four: Nap
