In line two, identify the parts of the sentence, using AVP for action verbs and LVP for linking verbs. In line three, identify any prepositional phrases you see. In line four, identify each clause.

If you need review, please consult any of the previous Poodle books. However, here is a quick reminder. The four levels and their abbreviations are:

Parts of Speech: n., pron., adj., v., adv., prep., conj.,
interj.

Parts of Sentence: subj., AVP, LVP, D.O., S.C.

Phrases: prep. phrase

Clauses: clause

It should look like this when you are finished:
