



Conjunctions are junctions.

Conjunctions join other parts of speech
(other kinds of words) together.

Two nouns: Jane and Mark swam.

Two verbs: We laughed and sang.

Two adjectives: He was strong and fast.

Two adverbs: She wrote quickly and well.

Here is a secret. Conjunctions do not like to join things that
are different from each other. A conjunction will join two nouns,
two verbs, or two adjectives, but it hates to join a noun to an adjective!
