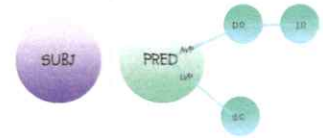


The indirect object
is a noun or pronoun
between the action verb
and the direct object;
it is indirectly affected by the action.

Elmer told **them** the tall tale.
subj. AVP I.O. D.O.

Susan offered **Joe** a new fishhook.
subj. AVP I.O. D.O.



Notice: You **MUST** have
a direct object before you
can have an indirect object,
but if there is an indirect object,
it comes first!
