You are free to write a story that is funny, to use your imagination, and to invent something that could never happen in real life. Do not use contractions such as *isn't* or *don't* or *it's*. Have fun writing.

NOUN: building, street, sidewalk, pie, cinema, bus, car, town, tree, park, canal, man, woman, boy, girl, countenance

PRONOUN: I, you, he, she, they, it, we, they, me, him, her, them, us, them, mine, yours, his, hers, theirs, its, ours, theirs

ADJECTIVE: tall, gray, fast, brown, sunny, green, long, shady, old, nice, a, an, the, my, your, his, her, its, our, their, serene

VERB: ran, walked, was, is, went, sold, painted, rode, attended, grew, flowed, waved

ADVERB: slowly, quickly, backwards, suddenly, unexpectedly, gradually, confidently, away

CONJUNCTION: and, but, or, nor, for, so, yet, if, as, since, when, because

PREPOSITION: in, on, under, beside, over, around, near, before, during, after, for, like

INTERJECTION: oh, yes, no, wow, yikes, oops, gee, well, ah
