



But if the verb is not an action verb,
we may find a linking verb
making an equation between
the subject and the subject complement.

COMPLEMENT?

A **complement** is not a compliment.
A compliment is saying something nice.
The word *complement* means to complete.
A subject complement can be
a noun, a subject pronoun,
or even an adjective.
A direct object can never be an adjective.

Linking verbs link
subject complements to subjects.

His favorite room was the **library**.

adj.	adj.	n.	v.	adj.	n.
		subj.	LVP		S.C.

The noun *library* complements the subject *room*.
