Combining Knowledge to Use Pronouns

Now you know the eight **parts of speech**,
and you know five **parts of the sentence**.

What can you do with these two levels of grammar?
You can use pronouns correctly because they are logical!

THOMPSON'S UNIFIED PRONOUN RULE:

A subject is a subject,
and an object is an object.

Anything called a subject uses subject pronouns:

I, you, he, she, they, it, we, you, they

Anything called an object uses object pronouns:

me, you, him, her, them, it, us, you, them
