



Each group of words with a subject
and predicate center in it is a clause.

The **grocer arranged** the vegetables

is a clause and

then **he arranged** the fruit

is a clause.

Each clause has its own subject/predicate.

If we take this clause:

The **kids played** softball

and use a conjunction to add it to this clause:

we watched them

we get one sentence with two clauses:

The **kids played** softball, and **we watched** them.

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
