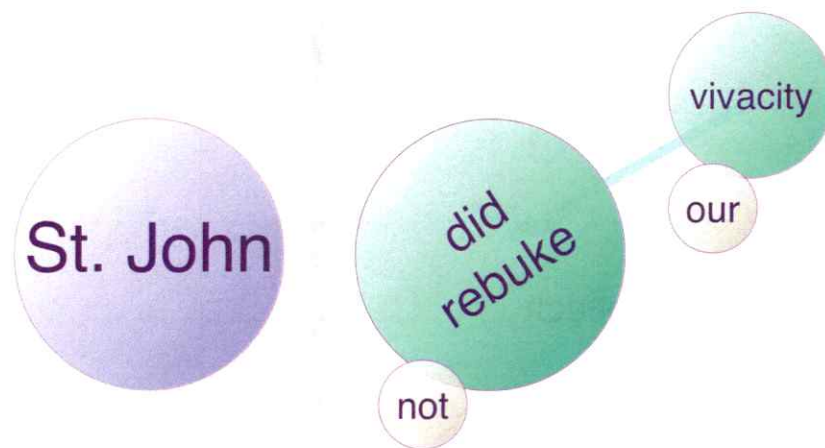




From Charlotte Brontë's *Jane Eyre*:

This sentence from *Jane Eyre* is typically efficient, doing its job with well-chosen verbs and nouns. Notice that the verb *did rebuke* is interrupted by an adverb, *not*. Notice also that *our* is a possessive adjective, modifying a noun; the possessive pronoun is *ours*. Even though we have not yet studied the four levels of grammar, I will give you previews like this so that you can begin to anticipate our path. We will refer to any graphic model such as the one above as an MCT model, or t-model for short. Literary vocabulary words will appear in black.
